IMPORTANT NOTICES

If you are Disputing a Violation Ticket, and you do not appear on the date set for your hearing, the allegation or fine shall be deemed not to be disputed. A conviction will be added to your driving record, and the ticketed amount on the Violation Ticket is immediately payable to the government.

If you require the services of an interpreter, you must notify the Court location named above immediately upon receipt of this notice.

If you wish to request a reduction in the ticketed amount and/or request time to pay the ticketed amount *without appearing in person on the above noted hearing date*, you may attend at the Court location named above, in person, and complete a Violation Ticket Statement and Written Reasons form. After the Justice considers your application you will be notified by mail of the result.

If you intend to be represented by a lawyer, or if you intend to make a legal argument* with or without the assistance of a lawyer, you should notify the Court location named above immediately to ensure your case can be heard on the Court date that has been set.

- A legal argument is defined as an argument where there is an interpretation of a statute, charter relief is sought, or there is an application of a previous case to the disputant's circumstances.

Information Concerning the Court Hearing on a Violation Ticket:

- The enforcement officer or prosecutor may be appearing by video conferencing or telephone.
- That for certain Provincial offences the enforcement officer may present his/her evidence by way of written certificate which sets out the evidence of the alleged offence. With leave of the Court you may request that the enforcement officer attend in court for the purposes of cross examination. If granted, the matter may have to be adjourned to another date for the officer to appear.

If you cannot appear on the date set for the hearing, you or someone acting on your behalf (your agent) may apply for an adjournment by completing an Application to Adjourn a Hearing form (PTR 818) and submitting it via fax, mail, or in person to the court registry listed on this notice. Forms are available at all court registries, or on the internet at www.ag.gov.bc.ca/courts/forms/ptr/ptr818.pdf

If you are Disputing a Municipal Ticket, and you do not appear on the date set for your hearing, you may be deemed to not wish to dispute the matter, and a conviction may be entered in your absence. If you cannot appear on the date set for your hearing, refer to the adjournment application procedures outlined above.
